### HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS INVITED TO ATTEND UM HONORS INSTITUTE

#### MISSOULA --

High school juniors can earn college credit for learning about lasers, human migration or literature about landscape during the 1995 K.R. Schwanke Honors Institute, to be held June 19-30 at The University of Montana - Missoula.

Each student can choose one of three introductory courses: "Money and Migrations: Modeling Human Movement," taught by geography Assistant Professor Christiane von Reichert; "Light, Optics and Lasers," taught by physics Assistant Professor James Jacobs; and "Reading the Land," taught by environmental studies graduate student Jim McGrath and forestry instructor Sandie McQuillan.

To be eligible for the institute, applicants must finish their junior year of high school by June 1995, have at least a 3.0 grade-point average and be in the top 10 percent of their class.

UM will award full and partial scholarships that cover on-campus housing, meal plans and tuition. All applicants are automatically considered for the scholarships, which are awarded based on GPA, class standing and financial need.

Established in 1987, the institute is named for state Board of Regents member Kermit Schwanke of Missoula.
