HEARING WORKSHOPS OFFERED LOCALLY FOR OLDER ADULTS MISSOULA--

The Rural Consortium for Health Outreach Information and Screening (CHOIS) is sponsoring free hearing information screenings and check-ups for adults age 60 and over. CHOIS is a project of the Rural Institute on Disabilities at The University of Montana-Missoula.

"Taking Charge of Your Health: Hearing Information and Check-up" will provide information and handouts on hearing aids and other assistive devices for the hard of hearing, selfhelp strategies and referrals. Interested people can have their hearing tested at the screenings.

The consortium involves UM's departments of social work and nursing, the UM School of Pharmacy, Community Medical Center and the Western Montana Agency on Aging.
