DISCUSSION:

Chairman Sterling Rygg called to order the twenty-sixth meeting of the Revenue and Finance Committee in Room 437 of the Capitol at 12:35 p.m., Saturday, March 18. All members were present.

The committee discussed the question raised by the General Government Committee that the last twelve (12) words of subsection 2 of section 6 were in possible contradiction to General Government's section 4.

We voted unanimously not to reopen section 6.

After more discussion as to not having to open section 6, a motion to reconsider passed by a vote of 7-2.

Mr. Driscoll made a motion that we ask for a suspension of rules but then withdrew his motion.

It was then decided by a vote of 8-1 to attempt to let our section stand against the General Government's section and hope that our comments would show that the committee had meant for an initiative measure only to direct the Legislature to divert funds and not allow the people to appropriate these funds.

The meeting adjourned.
