The University Certificate of Qualification to Teach. A University Teachers Certificate will be granted those graduates of the Univ. who satisfactorily meet the following requirements:

1st General Knowledge. Each candidate for the Univ. Teachers Certificate must hold the Bachelor's or Master's degree from this Univ.

2d. Professional Knowledge.

He must have taken the following special courses in Philosophy and Education.
 Elementary Psychology (Psy I and II) - 5 hours
 Principles of Teaching (Course II in Educ. - 2 hrs
 History of Education " I in Educ. - 3.

High School Pedagogy or Educational Psychology. 3 hrs
 and 3 hours selected from work offered by the Department.

3d. He must in the judgment of his instructors not only have an adequate knowledge of the subjects studied, but also possess those qualifications essential to success in teaching; it being understood that work acceptable as a part of the requirements for graduation may not justify the granting of a Teachers Certificate.

4th. To have his certificate engraved with the names of special subjects of the high school curriculum, the candidate must have completed normally 70 hours of work in the subject or group of closely allied subjects which he expects to teach. The ultimate decision as to the student's proficiency in these subjects resting with the departments concerned.

All general questions relating to the student's professional work are under the supervision of a special committee of which the Professor of Education is

Chairman.] The recommendations for the teachers certificate are made to the faculty through this committee,

On motion the recommendation was adopted. The Committee on Program was to consist of Prof. Elrod, Aber, Reiley, Sibley, Corbin.
