### THE JUSTIN MILLER PRIZE

The Board of Editors takes pleasure in announcing that the Justin Miller Prize will be awarded again this year—a \$100 United States War Bond to be awarded to the author of the best student comment published in this issue. The winner of the 1943 award was William M. Scott, Jr.

Justin Miller, Associate Justice of the United States Court of Appeals, Washington, D. C., was a member of the first graduating class of Montana State University Law School in 1913. He delivered the commencement address at Montana State University in 1941, at which time he received an honorary Doctor of Laws degree. The leading article in the Spring 1941 issue of the Montana Law Review, "Uniform Criminal Law Administration," was contributed by Justice Miller.
