Celebrated French director Agnes Varda, French filmmaker Liliane de Kermadec, "Gettysburg" director Ron Maxwell, screenwriter Duane Dell'Amico, screenwriter and UCLA professor Lew Hunter, filmmaker Abbe Wool and filmmaker Amy Halpern will all be available for interviews, either individually or collectively. ■ All of the filmmakers listed above except Varda will attend a reception at 8:30 p.m. Friday, April 19, at the home of Robert and Karin Knight, 242 E. Beckwith. The media are invited to attend the reception.

■ Varda will be available for interviews Monday and Tuesday, as well as Wednesday morning. She leaves Missoula Wednesday afternoon. She will discuss and present two of her films, "Les demoiselles vingt ans apres" and "Les 101 nuits," Tuesday evening at the Crystal Theatre beginning at 7 p.m.

■ De Kermadec will arrive in Missoula Monday and stay throughout the week. She will present her film "La Piste du Telegraphe" at 1 p.m. Saturday in the Crystal Theater.

■ Maxwell will be available Wednesday through Friday. He will present "Gettysburg" at 7 p.m. Thursday at the Crystal and will discuss the film as part of a panel discussion Friday noon in Student Health Services Room 003.

■ Dell'Amico, Hunter and Wollen will be available Friday and Saturday. On Friday, Dell'Amico will lead a seminar at 3:30 p.m. in the Dell Brown Room of UM's Turner Hall, and Wollen will discuss "Forms of Narrative in Cinema" at 6:30 p.m. in Journalism 304. Hunter will lead a seminar at 3:30 p.m. Saturday in the Dell Brown Room.

■ Wool and Halpern will be available on the weekend. Wool will present her film "Roadside Prophets," at 7 p.m. Saturday in the Crystal; Halpern will present her film "Falling Lessons" at 1 p.m. Sunday in Journalism 304.
