KUFM/KGPR RADIO BROADCASTS CONGRESSIONAL CANDIDATE DEBATES

MISSOULA --

Back-to-back debates with candidates vying for Montana's lone U.S. congressional seat will be carried live on KUFM/KGPR, Montana Public Radio, Wednesday and Thursday, May 29-30.

The debates will begin both nights at 7:30 p.m. on The University of Montana—Missoula campus. The first night will feature Democratic candidates Leo Hudetz, Larry Jent, Mignon Waterman and Bill Yellowtail. Republican candidates Alan Mikkelsen, Dwight MacKay and Rick Hill will square off the following night..

Montana Public Radio can be heard on FM 89.1 and 91.5 in Missoula; 91.7 in Whitefish and Helena; 98.3 in White Sulphur Springs; 107.1 in Marysville; 89.9 in Great Falls; and 99.3 in Butte.

The debates, sponsored by UM, the Missoulian and the League of Women Voters, are free and open to the public in the Montana Theatre of UM's Performing Arts and Radio/Television Center.
