## ASUM CENTRAL BOARD MINUTES

UC Conference Room 114

November 6, 1985

7:00 p.m.

The ASUM Central Board meeting was called to order by Amy Johnson, ASUM Vice President. Members present were Barbee, Boyer, Craig, Crawford, Crippen, Duval, Henderson, Hussein, McKittrick, Neuman, Pinter, Solomon, Stuart, Sullivan, Tempel, Thompson, Tuss (arrived 7:10), Wold, Gullickson and Cawley. Mercer, Miller and Pouliot were excused.

1. The minutes of October 30, 1985 were approved as written.

### BUSINESS MANAGER'S REPORT

2. Gullickson presented members with copies of revisions, proposed by the Budget and Finance Committee, to the Fiscal Policy. Gullickson assured the Board that the Fiscal Policy will be presented to CB next week in its entirety. He reminded members that this is the last week to make any comments to Budget and Finance members.
3. Gullickson introduced a special allocation request from Programming to fund an Arts Film Series winter and spring quarters. Budget and Finance Committee has tabled the request and has suggested that Programming do a survey to evaluate interest in the series.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS

4. Johnson read a letter of resignation from Steven Calger, ASUM representative to the Missoula City Council. Calger stated personal problems as reason for his resignation. Calger thanked ASUM executives and Shaun Egan, SAC Director, for the enjoyment and feeling of accomplishment he has received while serving on the council.
5. McKittrick reported that ASCRC has finished the guidelines for class descriptions and one-time classes.
6. Crawford reported that the Student Health Committee had a general introduction meeting. The Blue Cross representative presented the committee with some new facts and figures regarding claim costs.
7. Sullivan reported that the Campus Development Committee has announced that North Corbin Hall will be closed at the end of fall quarter.



8. Boyer reported that the Election Committee met to review the sections of the proposed ASUM Constitution that deal with election procedures. He announced that the committee will meet again next Tuesday and that the time/place will be posted in ASUM.
9. Tempel reported that Student Union Board (SUB) will meet tomorrow at 3:00 p.m.

#### NEW BUSINESS

10. **Boyer - Gullickson** -- Motion to suspend a previous Central Board agreement and allow a vote on the proposed resolution from the ASUM Contract Negotiations Committee (Appendix A). Upon vote, motion passed.

**McKittrick - Gullickson** -- Motion to approve the resolution as written. Upon vote, motion passed.

Craig, Chair of the Contract Negotiations Committee, thanked members of the committee for their hard work.


#### COMMENTS

10. **McKittrick** -- Craig did an excellent job of speaking when the people from South America came here last week. I think the rally went really well, Shaun. A lot of people in the crowd were asking where Amy and Bill were and I wish there could have some kind of administrative representation there. As far as the issue about the Kaimin goes, I talked to Bill for a long time about this and there are somethings that I don't agree with, but I was able to hear him out. I think it would be in order to seriously consider if this is what you want to do with the Kaimin.
11. **Tuss** -- Congratulations to Shaun on the rally. I wish there would have been more student participation not only from all students, but certainly from this group. ASUM leaders, I wish you could have shown more support. Mike, congratulations on the resolution. It is very good and I hope it goes over well. About the Kaimin issue, when I was in Bozeman for the Bobcat-Griz game, a Bozeman student senator told me that she was concerned about the ties between our administration and the Kaimin. There is more concern than we think here and it is a very important issue. I hope that there will be much debate when the issue of PUB comes up.

## Presented by the Contract Negotiations Committee

- Whereas: The Associated Students of the University of Montana are concerned with the quality of their education, a quality of education that is reflected through the quality of faculty, quality of curriculum, and quality of the institution's facilities; and,
- Whereas: The rate of compensation to faculty affects the quality of education they provide to students; and,
- Whereas: The rate of compensation to faculty affects the overall morale of the University; and,
- Whereas: The ability to attract and retain qualified personnel is associated with the compensation rate; and,
- Whereas: The quality of faculty is a contributing factor toward the education and curriculum provided; and,
- Whereas: Quality of education and curriculum is reflected in the ability of the University to attract and retain students; and,
- Whereas: The students are directly affected by any breakdown of negotiations between the collective bargaining units; and,
- Whereas: Student participation is limited in its scope regarding the contract negotiation process as defined in Montana law; and,
- Whereas: It is in the interest of students to have a broader level of participation in matters pertinent to University policy; and,
- Whereas: The Board of Regents is the public employer of University faculty and is the governing body of University policy;
- Therefore: Be it resolved that ASUM Central Board utilize existing resources to gauge the opinion of the general student population and let that opinion be known to the representatives of the two parties currently involved in the contract negotiation process; and

Be it further resolved that the Associated Students of the University of Montana, in realizing what ramifications exist in the event of a breakdown in contract negotiations between the representatives of the faculty and the representatives of the Board of Regents, do hereby urge that the two parties involved in the current contract negotiations reach an expedient and equitable agreement and heed the students' concerns and interests, which are directly tied to the outcome of said negotiations.

Subject: Resignation of Student Representative position


