## ASUM CENTRAL BOARD MINUTES

Montana Rooms

May 7, 1986

7:00 p.m.

The ASUM Central Board meeting was called to order by Tuss, ASUM President. Members present were Bettise, Chor, Connor, Dorsett, English, Exe-O'Neil (arrived 7:15), Finley, Hill, Israel (arrived 7:10), Johnson, Miller, Norman, Perry, Schoenen (arrived 7:30), Sherry, Small, Snelson, Stoick (Bev), Stoick (Rod), Young, McLeod, Henderson, and Cawley.

1. The minutes of April 30, 1986 were approved as written.

### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

1. **Dorsett - Bettise** -- Motion to ratify Erik Cushman as ASUM Programming's Pop Concerts Coordinator. Upon vote, motion passed.
2. **Ky Boyd, 1985-86 ASUM Programming Director**, addressed the Board with an overview of this year's Programming events. Boyd stated that he feels positive with what Programming accomplished this year. He added that Programming took a lot of heat last year over its lecture series; i.e., Hunter S. Thompson, and that Programming was greatly improved this year in the areas of Lectures and Films.
3. **Tuss Announcements:**

Tuss received a report from Steve Bennyhoff, of the Commissioner of Higher Education office, addressing ASUM's assessment fee concerns. The report officially takes the UM Administration's position that the assessment fee charged ASUM is fair. It states that the assessment fee is charged to all University departments--not just ASUM. Tuss reported that he still plans to take the issue to the Board of Regents in the near future.

Tuss reported that the University Homeowner's Association has recommended to the Missoula City Council their approval of the University parking-permit district. The City Council will make a final decision on the parking proposal Monday, May 12 at 7:00. Tuss urged CB members to contact Council members and encourage them to reject the proposal. CB members will be supplied with names, addresses, and phone numbers of Council members.

Tuss thanked CB members who have been manning a mall table so that students may write their state and national representatives concerning education financial aid cutbacks. ASUM has already mailed 350 postcards and will continue to have a mall table to promote the "write your representative" campaign.

Tuss reported that he will be writing to Governor Schwinden to express the importance that the student's perspective be considered during selection of the new member to the Board of Regents. This student member should be able to exclusively represent the students of the Montana University System.



Tuss thanked everyone who attended the question and answer period for UM presidential candidate Robert Berdahl. Tuss gave members the interview time schedules for the remaining candidates.

#### VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

4. McLeod urged everyone to take their turn manning the CB mall table on Wednesdays. She added that it shouldn't be the responsibility of just a few members to see that it is done.

McLeod announced that she still needs CB members to serve on the Student Health Committee.

PUB Board has decided that it wants to interview all potential candidates for the at-large PUB positions. Anyone who is interested needs to pick up an application and apply.

5. **Hill - Henderson** -- Motion to approve John Neuman as an ex-officio member of the Constitutional Review Board. Discussion followed. Upon vote, motion failed to get the 2/3 requirement for ratifying an ex-officio member.

**Snelson - Henderson** -- Motion to approve Carol Van Valkenburg as the PUB Board faculty advisor. Van Valkenburg would be a non-voting member. Discussion followed. **Dorsett - Small** -- Motion to table the main motion and invite Van Valkenburg to address the Board at next week's meeting. Upon vote, motion to table passed.

#### BUSINESS MANAGER'S REPORT

6. Henderson announced that the Budget and Finance Committee will begin to review the ASUM Fiscal Policy at their next weekly meeting.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS

7. Perry reported that the **Library Archives Committee** had its first and last meeting for this quarter, and addressed its Contingency Plan concerns.
8. Sherry reported that the next **Campus Development** meeting will be Tuesday, May 13, 3:00-5:00. She encouraged members to attend as the committee will be addressing some important issues.
9. Young, **Auxiliary Services Overview Committee**, reported that she voted to create a tie (Young is the committee chair) on the motion to approve a UC renovation fee, because two of the committee's members were absent and she felt they needed to be able to express their positions. She added that the motion to approve a campus recreation fee was tabled until the committee is able to meet with Keith Glaes, Campus Recreation Director.

#### NEW BUSINESS

10. Young, Auxiliary Services Overview Committee, announced that the committee will be bringing its recommendations on the proposed fee increases to Central Board next week.

11. **Small - Dorsett** -- Motion that the first agenda item, at the first meeting next fall, will be to deal with the ASUM Administration's alternative to budgeting (group carry-over). Discussion followed. Upon vote, motion passed.

#### COMMENTS

12. **Tuss** - Congratulations to Terry on Aber Day. With the attitude that the administration had, and quite seriously, if we didn't do it up good this year there wouldn't be an Aber Day next year. All accounts of Aber Day have been good.

Congratulations to Erik Cushman on his Pop Concerts Coordinator appointment.

I talked to Tim Huneck on the phone and he wants to know where his \$9,999 are.

There will be a county commissioners forum Thursday night, 8:00 p.m., Mount Sentinel Room between candidates John Weidenfeller and Janet Stevens .

13. **Bettise** - Would like to express disappointment in the Board for not approving John Neuman. I feel that we really needed some help in getting started and I hope that we will be able to keep things under control. Neuman would have been a great asset to the committee. I voted against approving Van Valkenburg, because I think it is a good idea for the Board to meet with her. She is a fair lady and would be a great PUB Board advisor.
14. **Connor** - Would also like to express disappointment that we didn't accept John and Carol as advisors to these committees. We need to take advantage of the expertise that these people command.

The UC fee increase will be coming before the Board soon, and after taking a tour of the UC, I feel that the fee is needed. I would strongly encourage you to support the fee increase.

Congratulations to Terry on Aber Day and also to everyone who participated and got other students involved. I would like to express a little disappointment in the student body that failed to show an interest in Aber Day.

15. **Hill** - Would like to thank Ky Boyd and Programming for talking with us tonight. Would also like to thank IFC for all their hard work at Aber Day. Disappointed that we didn't ratify John Neuman.
16. **Norman** - Thanks to Ky Boyd and would like to invite Tracey Morin to also come to CB. Would like to see the journals that ASUM receives. Maybe we could keep them out by the front desk. I hope that John Neuman will still come to the CRB meetings and give us some guidance.
17. **Schoenen** - I would like to personally thank all of you for doing your part for Aber Day. Paul, call Tim and tell him that his \$9,999 is in the Yearbook budget.
18. **Sherry** - I want you all to know that the crew on the front page of the Kaimin was my crew. They were from the Wind Ensemble. We all had a good time and I owe them pizza and coke. I appreciate the work Terry did getting Aber Day organized.
19. **Small** - The new CB beat the old CB two straight games of volleyball at Aber Day. Congratulations to Terry Schoenen. I had a good time at Aber Day and I hope next year we can introduce a little more spirit from the students.

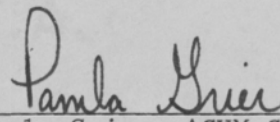
Quote from Doug Treadwell, President at Western, "The job of a university president isn't to put up roadblocks but to help students do what they need to do."
