Missoula, Montana,

September 11, 1909.

The first meeting of the Faculty of the University of Montana for the academic year 1909-1910 was called to order by President C. A. Duniway at 2:30 P. M. The members of the Faculty absent were Elrod, Cox, Stewart and Whitaker.

The President announced the appointment of Acting Registrar J. B. Speer as Secretary of the Faculty to succeed Professor F. C. Scheuch. *Appointment of Secretary*

Moved by Professor Aber and seconded by Professor Rowe that the Faculty give to Professor Scheuch its very sincere thanks for his faithful and efficient service as Secretary of the Faculty for the preceding fourteen years, 1895-1909. The motion was unanimously adopted. *Expression of Thanks to Retiring Secretary*

The schedule of courses for the first semester, 1909-1910, was discussed and a schedule completed. *Schedule*

Moved by Rowe and seconded by Book that afternoon laboratory periods begin at 1:30 and end at 4:30. A substitute motion was offered by Professor Aber and accepted that laboratory periods may extend from 1:30 to 4:30 at the discretion of the departments concerned, except in cases of conflict with required work. The substitute motion was unanimously adopted. *Schedule Lab. Periods*

Moved by Rowe and seconded by Book that no student having conditions may register for more than 15-1/2 hours of new work, except by permission of the Committee on Admission and Registration. The motion was unanimously adopted. *Hours for Students 15 1/2*

The President read to the Faculty a revised codification of "Information for the Guidance of Students". Moved by Book and seconded by Aber that this codification be adopted by the Faculty. The motion was unanimously adopted. *Codification of Rules for Students*

Moved by Scheuch and seconded by Book that a committee of three be appointed by the President to go over the extracts

from the minutes of the Faculty as compiled by Professor Scheuch and report a codification of these rules. The motion was unanimously adopted and the President appointed Scheuch, Book and Speer members of the committee.

There being no further business before the Faculty the meeting adjourned.

The Faculty met on the call of the President at 4:10 P. M. Absent: Whitaker and Buckhouse.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The following additions were made in the schedule, each addition being unanimously adopted:

Geology, XIVA, Blow-Pipe Anal., Tues. & Thur. af'ns.

Latin IX, Teachers' Course, 11:30 T. Th. F., instead of Latin VII, Lucretius.

Chemistry I, General, Second lab. section, Tues. & Thur. af'ns.

Physics I, Second lab. section M. af'n and Sat. morning at 8:30.

Several announcements were also made concerning changes of hours of different courses in the schedule.

Moved and seconded that the invitation of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary of Louisville, Kentucky, to the celebration of its fiftieth anniversary of founding be referred to the President for answer. The motion was unanimously adopted.

Invitation

Moved by Scheuch and seconded by Rowe that the President be considered ex officio a member of all standing committees of the Faculty. The motion was unanimously adopted.
