The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.


The request of the Executive Committee of the A. S. U. M. # 26
that the Faculty approve the amendment to its constitution H. S. U. M.

adding two more student members to the Executive Committee was read, and, on motion of Elrod, seconded by Rowe, the amendment was unanimously approved.

The President outlined to the Faculty a plan which he might conclude to submit to the State Board of Education for summer sessions, and uniting with this ^a provision for leaves of absence on half pay to those who would teach in summer sessions. 
Miss Lovett has credit for 3 hours in History and Economics instead of the minimum requirement of 6 hours.

Mr. Winninghoff has no credit in History and Economics, and 2 hours credit in Literature and Philosophy instead of the minimum of 6 hours.

June 3, 1910- Continued.

Moved and seconded that the Faculty recommend to the State Board of Education that the above candidates for graduation be granted degrees as indicated; except, in the case of Mr. D. L. Maclay, his name shall be stricken off the list of candidates if his incomplete work is not finished by Saturday. Elrod moved to amend, seconded by Scheuch, that Mr. W. J. Winninghoff be recommended for the degree of Bachelor of Science instead of Bachelor of Arts. The amendment and the motion were unanimously adopted.

Moved by Rowe and seconded by Carey that the Faculty proceed to the election of the Manager of the A. S. U. M. The motion was adopted. A ballot was then taken and Mr. R. N. Thompson was duly declared elected. *Election*

The Faculty then proceeded to ballot for the faculty members of the various A. S. U. M. Committees, and the following were duly declared elected:

For members of the Executive Committee: Professors Underwood and Plant.

For member Athletic Committee: Professor Book.

For member Debate Committee; Professor Scheuch.

For member Oratorical Committee: Professor Corbin.

Moved by Book and seconded by Reynolds that a special committee on scholarship be appointed. The motion was unanimously adopted and the President appointed Professors Book, Reynolds and Plant members of the committee. *Special Committee on Scholarship*

On motion, the meeting adjourned.
