Moved by Harkins and seconded by Richter that regular classes in the second semester begin at 8:15 and that the noon is cess extend from 12:15 to 1:30. A substitute motion was made by Rowe and seconded by Plant that classes begin at 8:30 as at present and that the noon recess extend from 12:30 to 2:00. The sistitute motion was lost and the original motion was adopted by a vote of 11 to 8.

Schedule Committee on Schedule and Examinations. On motion of Richter, sconded by Book, the schedule as reported was unanimously adopted

The Faculty formally approved new courses offered by to departments of English, Geology, Literature, Engineering, Mathematics, Physics and the Library.

On motion of E. F. A. Carey, seconded by Richter, it was unanimously voted to hold a meeting of the Faculty on Friday after Meeting registration, and that all requests for changes in the schedule presented at that time through the Committee on Schedule and Exanations.

Meeting adjourned.

January 18, 1911.

The regular monthly meeting of the Faculty was held at 4:10 P. M. with all members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approed.

Moved by Aber and seconded by Thompson to adopt the reort of the committee. Rowe moved to amend, seconded by Reynolds,

The President read a petition signed by 112 students for # 42 oproval of a dance on January 30th. He also read a request from H.5, U. M. he Junior Class for a dance on Saturday, January 21st.

Moved by Scheuch and seconded by Richter that the request or a dance on January 30th be granted. Kirkwood moved to amend, conded by Thompson, that the request be granted, but with the statent that the Faculty would prefer Saturday evening, January 28th, stead of Monday evening, January 30th. The amendment was lost by te of 2 to 11. The original motion was adopted.

Moved and seconded to refer the petition from the Junior ass to the Committee on Student Affairs with power to act. The tion was unanimously adopted.

Moved by Elrod and seconded by Reynolds to reconsider the ars for the morning schedule of classes. The motion was adopted by te of 11 to 6. Moved by Richter and seconded by Plew to amend the Schedule tion that classes begin at 8:15 and close for the noon recess at :15 by substituting the hours 8:00 A. M. and 12.00 o'elock noon.

e amendment was lost by a vote of 8 to 12. Moved by Aber and selected by Rowe, to amend the original motion, substituting 8:30 A. M. r 8:15 and that afternoon classes should begin at 1:45 instead of 30. The amendment was lost by a vote of 8 to 9. The main motion r the beginning of classes at 8:15 and the noon recess from 12:15 1:30 was then put to a vote and lost by a vote of 8 to 11.

The report of the special committee concerning compulsory tendance at Assembly, which was presented at the previous meeting of the Faculty, was read.

Moved by Elrod, seconded by Rowe, to adopt the report.

Dived by Rowe, and seconded by Thompson, to postpone consideration

the Faculty. The motion to postpone was adopted by a vote of 14

Moved by Elrod and seconded by Rowe, to adjourn to 4:10 onday, January 23rd and that the consideration of the report of the immittee on compulsory attendance at Assembly be made a special

January 18, 1911-continued. order of business. The motion was unanimously adopted and the Y. B. Speer meeting was adjourned. January 23, 1911. The Faculty met pursuant to adjournment at 4:10 P. M. Absent: R. H. Cary, Harkins, Hill, Plew, Shealy and Stoutemyer. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. The special order of business, concerning compulsory a tendance at Assembly, was taken up. Moved by Elrod and seconded by H. F. A. Carey to sub-Assembly stitute one half hour's credit instead of one hour's credit in paragraph 3b of the committee's report. The motion was unanimou ly adopted. The motion made at the previous meeting of the Faculty to adopt the report of the committee was then put and lost by a vote of four to six. Moved by Elrod and seconded by Aber that regular class Schedole be arranged at the 11:30 hour on Wednesdays. "A substitute motio was offered by Rowe and seconded by Plant that weekly assemblies held kold but that attendance should be voluntary. An amendment was made by Reynolds and seconded that the President explain to students the purpose of the Faculty in having voluntary attendan at assemblies. The amendment was unanimously adopted. The subs tute motion was adopted by a vote of nine to four. The registrar was instructed by the President and Facu to have a record taken of the attendance at the assemblies, incl ing the attendance of the members of the Faculty. The secretary read the recommendation of the special c Student mittee on scholarship concerning the employment of student assis-Hssistants. After discussion and an explanation by the President that the subject of employment was a matter solely in charge of the Executive Board, it was moved by Richter and seconded by E. F. A
