ASUM SENATE MINUTES
Mount Sentinel Room
May 4, 1988
6:00 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by Chairwoman Hiatt. Members present were Aylsworth, Cate, Fisher, Hagerman, Hollenbaugh, Long, Nelson, Page, Peterson, Pettinato, Prezeau, Redick (6:15), Rohweder, Schustrom (6:15), Sharp, Stoianoff, Wiltse, Wimmer, Yockey, Isern, and Hurlbut.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. The minutes of April 27 were approved as written.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2. Hal Stearns was introduced to the Senate. Stearns spoke about the Six Mill Levy. Stearns explained the Six Mill Levy was a base for income for the University System. Stearns stressed that the passage of the Six Mill Levy is extremely important. The failure of the levy could mean a \$500 or more increase per year in tuition for each student. Stearns encouraged the Senators to write to their home town newspapers and express their concerns about the Six Mill Levy. Stearns also encouraged the Senators to be registered voters and to get their friends and families to vote for the Six Mill Levy.

3. Isern introduced Sharon Spray-Warden for ratification as Programming Director. Spray-Warden spoke briefly about herself.

Isern - Hollenbaugh motioned to accept Sharon Spray-Warden as the Programming Director. Discussion followed. Upon vote, motion passed.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

4. Hiatt had no report for this meeting.

BUSINESS MANAGER'S REPORT

5. The Board on Budget and Finance approved line item changes for the Baseball Club, the Women's Rugby Club, and Panhellenic.

The Board on Budget and Finance tabled proposals from Campus Recreation and the Kaimin.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

6. The Bylaws Review Committee met on Tuesday, May 3, and reviewed a majority of the Bylaws. The primary purpose of the review was to revise the antiquated language.
7. The Legal Services Committee met and discussed the possibility of experimental fees.

8. Isern - Fisher motioned to accept Isern's Admissions Standards Proposal. Discussion followed. Upon vote, motion failed.

NEW BUSINESS


9. Fisher - Long motioned to suspend the Bylaws and vote upon the Isern - Long Admissions Standards Proposal. Upon vote, motion passed.

THE PROPOSED ADMISSIONS STANDARDS FOR
THE MONTANA UNIVERSITY SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the Admissions Task Force chaired by Dr. Albrecht, Deputy Commissioner for Academic Affairs, reports that admissions standards leads to higher rates of retention and more accurate predictions of success, and;


WHEREAS, admissions standards indicate the institution's expectations of a student, and;

WHEREAS, the intent of admissions standards is to raise the quality and level of preparation of those students entering college, and;

WHEREAS, exemptions and special consideration for non-traditional students are included as part of the Admissions Standards Proposal.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the ASUM Senate supports the proposed system-wide Admissions Standards at the lower level as outlined in the Admissions Task Force Report.

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Senate encourages student participation and consultation as the Board of Regents makes it final decision on the Admissions Standards issue.
