ASUM SENATE MINUTES
October 5, 1988

6:00 p.m.

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 by Chairwoman, Hiatt. Senators present were Aylsworth, Cate, Chaffin, Fisher, Hagerman, Hollenbaugh (6:05), Nelson, Page, Peterson, Pettinato (6:15), Redick, Rohweder, Stoianoff, Wiltse, Wimmer, and Yockey. Senators Long and Schustrom were excused. Senator Prezeau was unexcused.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes of September 28, 1988 were approved as written.

President's Report

1. Isern once again announced the two Senate vacancies due to Willie Sharp not returning to school and Amy Jo Fisher transferring. Fisher, however, will remain on the Senate for the duration of Fall Quarter. Isern explained that two new Senators will be selected by October 18th and ratified by October 19th. One Senator will be an ex-officio member until Fisher transfers Winter Quarter.
2. Isern encouraged the Senators to offer suggestions on the ASUM/R-106 entry in the Homecoming Parade. The Senators agreed that a car should be decorated with posters advertising R-106 and entered in the parade.

Vice President's Report

3. Hiatt announced the following committee appointments and asked that they be accepted as a slate.

Tracy Bernidini, Dell McCann, and Howard Crawford were appointed to the Student Legislative Action Committee.

Chad Stoianoff and Greg Yockey were appointed to the University Athletics Committee.

Kristin Page and Greg Yockey were appointed to the Vice President of Fiscal Affairs Search Committee.

Darren Cate was appointed to the Traffic and Security Committee.

Cherche Prezeau was appointed to ASCRC.

Lynn Israel and Jessi McConnell were appointed to the Graduate Council.

Chad Stoianoff and Ken Matson were appointed to the Health Service Committee.

Nancy Hiatt and Mark Rohweder were appointed to the Board on Member Organizations.

4. Hiatt asked for the Senators input on the future retreat. Yellow Bay, Fairmont, and Bitterroot Lake were some of the suggestions.

Business Manager's Report

5. Hurlbut reported that the Board on Budget and Finance met on Sunday, October 2, and further reviewed the Fiscal Policy.
6. Hurlbut reported that the Board on Budget and Finance also met on Tuesday, October 4, and dealt with a proposal by Campus Recreation, a Student Legislative Special Allocation, a S.T.I.P. request for Interfraternity Council, and the EVST forgery.

The motion to allocate the Student Legislative Action Committee \$180 from the Special Allocations fund came before the Senate as a seconded motion. Upon vote, the motion passed.

The motion to allocate the Interfraternity Council \$60 from the S.T.I.P. fund came before the Senate as a seconded motion. Upon vote, the motion passed.

Hurlbut explained to the Senators the travel voucher forged by an EVST. Advocate for reimbursement of monies spent on the January for the "Save the Wolf" trip. Hurlbut encouraged the Senators to uphold the decision made by the Board on Budget and Finance until they could all read the correspondence between ASUM and the EVST. Advocates and talk to some of the members involved. The Senators agreed not to press charges against the EVST member who forged the documents and to stand by Budget and Finance's decision to place the group on an indefinite suspension until EVST's charter and fiscal policy tightens its policies on the accounting procedure.

Committee Reports

7. Chaffin reported that the Student Legislative Committee has been writing letters to all the newspapers in Montana. Any help offered by the Senators would be greatly appreciated.
8. Page announced that ASCRC needs to have freshmen placed on the committee.

New Business

9. Isern - Aylsworth motioned to have the ASUM Senate request that the University of Montana adopt a Semester Calendar with a starting date after Labor Day.
