Professors Thompson and Underwood were declared elected the second ballot.

Moved by Rowe and seconded by E. F. A. Carey, that the present elective members of the A. S. U. M. committees on Athletics, Debate, and Oratory, (Athletic Committee, Professor Book; Debate Committee, Professor Scheuch; Oratorical Committee, Professor Corbin) be re-elected for the ensuing year. The motion was unanimously adopted.

A special meeting of the Faculty was held at 4:10 P. M. Absent: R. H. Cary, Hill.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Moved by Scheuch and seconded by Rowe to adopt the program reported by the Committee on Schedule and Examinations. The motion was unanimously adopted.

A recommendation from the Committee on Public Exercises concerning assemblies was read. It was moved by Aber and seconded by Scheuch and unanimously adopted to take up the recommendations by sections. The first section was unanimously adopted on motion of Rowe and E. F. A. Carey; the second on motion of Rowe and Elrod; the third, with one dissenting vote, on motion of Elrod and Aber; the fourth on motion of Aber and Plant. The following are the recommendations adopted:

["1. That official assemblies be held twice a month, with special programs and that the other Wednesdays be left open for special student meetings, etc.

2. That attendance at official assemblies be compulsory.

3. That any student absent more than twice in any semester without an excuse satisfactory to the President or

Some person designated by him, shall be required in lieu of such attendance, to secure one credit hour toward graduation.

4. That students habitually absent incur further discipline. "

Miss Smith asked the permission of the Faculty to give a third years work in Physical Culture for Women. On motion of Rowe, seconded by Book, the permission was unanimously granted.

Professor Reynolds asked the approval of the Faculty for the organization of a national honorary debating and oratorical society known as Tau Kappa Alpha. On motion the matter was unanimously referred to the President and Professor Reynolds with power to act.


