APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. The minutes of October 26 were approved as written.

BUSINESS MANAGER'S REPORT

2. Hurlbut reported that the Board on Budget and Finance met on Tuesday and reviewed the funds granted to the International Students Association. The Board will meet on Monday at 7:30 p.m. to finish the changes on the fiscal policy.

3. A special allocation of \$3,177.80 came before the Senate as a seconded motion.

Aylsworth - Schustrom made a substitute motion to amend the amount to \$2,077.80. Discussion followed. Upon vote, substitute motion failed.

Prezeau - Pettinato motioned to amend the main motion to \$2,488.80. Discussion followed. Upon vote, substitute motion failed.

Nelson - Pettinato motioned to amend the main motion to \$2,488.80 by reducing the total by \$689. Discussion followed. Upon vote, substitute motion passed.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

4. Isern introduced Ken Stoltz. Stoltz reviewed the parking changes and explained the reasoning behind the changes. Stoltz also explained that increased enrollment caused a greater parking shortage. Stoltz also added that not only enrollment was up, but that the percentage of freshman bringing cars to school was also up. Stoltz addressed questions from the Senators. The Senators commented on the parking shortage and offered several suggestions. Some suggestions included the return of Lot V to a decal lot and commuter privileges.
5. Isern reported that she, Hiatt, Kelley, and Temple attended a conference in Pullman, WA over the weekend. Isern stated that with much of the conference she was disappointed.

6. Isern encouraged all Senators to participate in the MAS Conference on Friday and Saturday.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

7. Hiatt announced the committee appointments for ratification.

9. Prezeau reported that ASCRC is reviewing the general education requirements for the semester conversion.

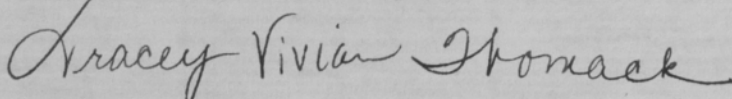
OLD BUSINESS

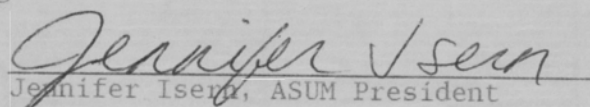
RESOLUTION FOR THE RETURN OF METERED LOT V TO DECAL LOT

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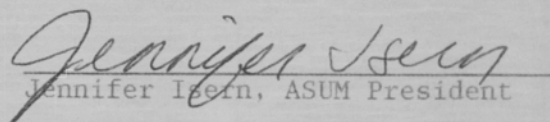
RESOLUTION FOR RETURN OF UNMETERED LOT SOUTH OF LODGE

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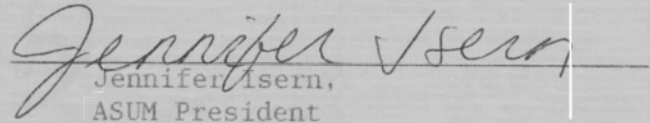
RESOLUTION FOR REDUCTION OF PARKING FEE
