
11. Isern - Redick motioned to take the Fiscal Policy from the table. Upon vote, motion passed.

Chairwoman Hielt called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m. Senators present were Aylsworth, Cate, Chaffin, Fisher, Hagerman, Hollenbaugh, Long, Nelson, Peterson, Redick, Rohweder, Wiltse, Wimmer, Yockey, Warden, Isern, and Hurlbut. Senators Page, Pettinato, and Prezeau were excused. Senators Schustrom and Stoianoff were unexcused.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. The minutes of November 9, 1988 were approved as written.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2. Hielt introduced Brad Martin and Fred Sargenson of MONTPIRG, Montana Public Interest Research Group. Sargenson explained that although the Can and Bottle Bill did not pass, it was one of the first times students organized enough to get an issue on the ballot since 1980. Martin said now that the election is over, MONTPIRG is open for suggestions and comments. Martin said MONTPIRG's ongoing concerns will include more consumer guides.
3. Hielt introduced Mike Craig, the 1988-89 Lobbyist. Craig briefly spoke about himself and his education. Craig expressed his great respect for ASUM and the University. He promised to work closely with ASUM, the Administration, and other lobbyists from the other schools in the University System.
4. Isern made several miscellaneous announcements.

Isern stated that next quarter she wanted to focus on campus security and safety. Isern passed out maps of campus lighting and encouraged the Senators to make a note of the dark areas around campus in preparation for this project.

Isern announced that the next Senate meeting will be January 11. Isern reminded the Senators that she is still looking for people to serve on the Elections Committee. She stressed that those intending to run for a seat again may not serve on this committee. Isern also reminded the Senators that she is still looking for people to serve on the Personnel Policy Committee. Isern reported that she has been compiling position descriptions from all ASUM agency directors. Isern stressed that she still needs one for the Senators and the Advisors.

Isern announced that Chad Stoianoff will be resigning. He took a job with the Legislature. ASUM will announce the vacant seat after Christmas Break.
