**DAUGHTER OF PARK CITY MAN STUDYING IN EUROPE**

**MISSOULA--**

Sarah Jo Plucker, a German major at The University of Montana-Missoula, took her education overseas this semester to study in Europe through the Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures Spring Semester German Study Abroad Program.

Plucker, a 1993 graduate of Lebanon High School in Missouri, is the daughter of Wayne Plucker of **Park City**.

She has already spent one month studying and exploring Germany at Heidelberg and Neckargemünd. She lived with host families and attended the University of Heidelberg, which was founded in 1386. The last two months of the program will be spent in Vienna, Austria. She is improving her German-language skills through daily contact with Germans and Austrians and through formal course work.

She was awarded a \$150 Powell German Scholarship to help with expenses associated with the trip. The scholarship is presented to honor Ward Powell, who taught German for 24 years at UM.
