Hosences structors be requested to keep careful records of attendance. Moved by Plant and seconded by Kirkwood that all in-The motion was unanimously adopted.

Students

Moved by Plant and seconded by Phillips that the Director and the Principal of the Missoula County High School de-Co. High School cide on the matter of the admission of students from the local high school to the Summer School. The motion was unanimously adopted.

Entrance

Moved by Palmer and seconded by Thompson that recommendations of high school credits, earned in summer school, be made by the instructors concerned. Moved to amend by Speer, seconded by Kirkwood, that the maximum credit so recommended should not exceed one entrance unit. The amendment was unanimously adopted, and the motion as amended was unanimously carried.

Professor Corbin brought up the matter of the enrollment and credits of Miss Anna J. Faherty. Moved, seconded and unanimously adopted that the matter be referred to the Registrar.

The Director announced that a reception for the new members of the Summer School Faculty and students would be held Friday evening at 8:30 in Craig Hall.
