Approval of Minutes

The minutes of May 24, 1989 were approved as written.

President's Report

1. Escort Service - Darcy Schacher from the Escort Service came and handed out packets which disclosed figures for the program. The service could be expanded for next year to the Greek houses and Family Housing. There has been a record of where people have requested to go such as the footbridge, University Ave, etc. Schacher gave suggestions for next Fall if the program is continued. One suggestion was to have the operators take calls for the escorts and then transfer messages to their walkie-talkies. They would like to keep their \$2,000.00 carry-over for Fiscal Year 1988-1989.
2. Board of Regents and Special Session - Aylsworth announced that the Board of Regents meeting will be June 20 and 21 in Helena. They will request equal funding for UM and MSU. Friday of Finals Week, there will be a strategy meeting for the Special Session.

Business Manager's Report

1. Special Allocations
 - A. **Warden - Pierce** moved to approve the \$435.00 for ASUM Child Care to purchase a dishwasher. Upon vote, motion passed.

 - C. **Cate - Warden** moved to suspend the By-laws. Upon vote, motion to suspend passed. **Young - Warden** moved to allocate \$300.00 to ADSUM. Upon vote, motion passed.
2. Cate announced that ASUM is looking into buying a copy machine. He also announced that Senate Bill 395 passed which allows ASUM groups to purchase equipment off campus.

1. Sliter announced that SUB approved a proposal for the UM foundation to place a recognition wall in the UC.
2. Pierce announced that Campus Development Committee met and decided to remove the bricks for the UC-Library mall. They discussed other options and felt that removing the bricks was the best.

2. Programming Resolution - **Warden - Pierce** moved for Previous Question. Upon vote, Previous Question passed. Upon vote, the motion passed.

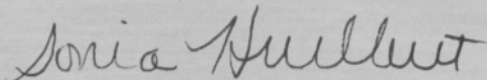
New Business
