ASUM Senate Minutes  
November 15, 1989  
Mount Sentinel Room

Chairman Long called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m. Members present were Senators Behr, Bernardini, Berg, Byars, D'Angelo, Dahlberg (6:10), Fairbanks, Gay, Hummel, Pierce, Pouncy, Price, Sebald, Sliter, Smith, Warden, Wilkinson (6:10), Young, President Aylsworth, and Business Manager Cate (6:10).

Approval of Minutes

Pierce - Sliter moved to approve the minutes of November 8, 1989. Upon vote, the motion passed.

President's Report

1. Aylsworth introduced Lynn Israel from the Computer Users' Advisory Committee. Ms. Israel discussed the Computer Users' Fee that every student must pay. Sylvia Weisenburger, Acting Vice President for Fiscal Affairs, will give CUAC more control over the fees. They may use the money to hire more monitors to keep the labs open longer. The committee will examine what students need vs. the kinds of computers on campus. A forum is being planned regarding fees that students pay. If the old computers on campus are returned to the company that sold us new ones, the University will receive \$130,000.00 in credit. Ms. Israel then responded to questions.
2. Aylsworth introduced Darcy Schacher, the student director of the ASUM Escort Service. Ms. Schacher handed out a packet with usage figures and costs to continue the program next quarter. The study compared Spring Quarter 1989 to this current quarter and shows an increase in the use of the service. Peak hours for the program are from 10:00 to 11:00 p.m. At the beginning of this quarter, the hours were from 9:00p.m. to 1:00 a.m. but they were changed from 8:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m. to accommodate for the earlier darkness. Ms. Schacher believes that a more effective program would be one that starts at 6:00 and runs to midnight and that only occurs on Sunday through Thursday evenings. She then responded to questions.
3. Regent's Presidential Search - Aylsworth announced that the Board of Regents will begin the search for the new president of the university. The selection committee will consists of five faculty, 2 students, and etc. Aaron is to send six names to the Commissioner of Higher Education and the students will be selected from those names.
4. Forestry School Position on Semester Transition - Aylsworth will be meeting with students from the School of Forestry regarding the change to semesters. He feels that this school will be effected the greatest due to the change in summer break. The meeting will take place at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, November 16, 1989 in the ASUM Offices.

Vice President's Report

1. There will be no ASUM Senate meeting next week due to the Thanksgiving Holiday.

2. Committee appointments

Pierce - D'Angelo moved to nominate Timothy Thomas for the ASUM Board on Budget and Finance. Upon vote, the motion passed.

Pierce - Sliter moved to nominate Nathan Wilkinson to the AIDS Information Committee. Upon vote, the motion passed.

3. Jay Cee's Christmas Project - Long announced that ASUM will be helping the Jay Cees with their Children's Christmas Project. Volunteers are needed to take under privileged children shopping for winter clothes. A Christmas Party is to follow in the University Center Gold Oak Room where the children will receive presents from Santa Claus. Long stressed that volunteers need to be committed because this is Christmas for these children and if a volunteer does not show up then for that child, Christmas will not come.

Business Manager's Report

1. S.T.I.P. Request - Cate introduced Keith Glaes from Campus REcreation. They are asking for \$5,000.00 to replace worn out weight machines in the weight rooms. The entire project will cost \$26,121.00 and money is being requested from various sources. Young - Pierce moved to approve. Upon vote, the motion passed.

Committee Reports

1. Pierce reported on the Health Service proposal for a self-funding insurance policy. The Health Service is seeking student/faculty/staff support. They feel that the benefits will outweigh the considerable risks.

Old Business

1. Open Information Laws - Discussion took place. Upon vote, the motion passed.
2. Safe Sex Project - Discussion took place. Upon vote, the motion passed.
3. Volunteer Coordinator position - Warden did not wish for his resolution to be discussed at this time.
4. Semester Transition Referendum - Discussion took place. Aylsworth - Sliter moved to table. Upon vote, the motion passed.
5. Statement of Funding - Sliter - Pouncy moved to remove the resolution from the table. Discussion took place. Sliter offered a substitute motion. Smith - Warden called objection to consideration. Upon vote, objection failed. Discussion followed. Pierce - Cate called previous question. Upon vote, previous question passed. Upon vote, the substitute motion failed. Discussion on the main motion continued. Warden - Young called previous question. Upon vote, previous question passed. Upon vote, the main motion failed.


New Business

## Safe Sex Project

Whereas, AIDS infection is increasingly common in smaller towns, among heterosexuals, and in college populations, including the University of Montana and Missoula. AIDS is almost twice as common among college students nationwide (1/500 students) than other groups, such as military recruits.

Whereas, at least two UM Students have died of AIDS.

Whereas, Between December, 1988, and March, 1989, nine people had positive AIDS tests at the Missoula County Health Department. This is a 200% increase over all previous time periods. Furthermore, these nine people were not out-of-staters, but were Montana, and Missoula residents, and had contacted the infection locally. They include UM students, faculty, and/or staff.

Whereas, Nationwide, and here at UM, there is an epidemic of other sexually transmitted diseases. Nationally, studies have shown that healthy college women without any infection symptoms have approximately 8% incidence of chlamydia, a 10% incidence of Human Papilloma Virus (HPV - genital warts), and 12% incidence of Herpes infections.

Whereas, Chlamydia is one of the most common causes of infertility due to scarring of the fallopian tubes. The UM Health Service sees approximately 40 cases of chlamydia monthly. Chlamydia caused infertility may occur without and symptoms of infection.

Whereas, HPV (genital warts) can cause cancer of the cervix. At the Health Service, they have 60 to 100 patient visits per month for HPV infection alone.

Whereas, Many more women than men are treated for all sexually transmitted diseases (STD's) which suggests the possibility that many men may be asymptomatic carriers of infection and may not know it.

Whereas, Most people who are infected with the AIDS virus or any sexually transmitted disease do not know they are infected. They may have had only one or a few previous sexual partners. The only sure way to avoid infection is to avoid exposing yourself to potential infection (i.e. sexual intercourse). If you choose to have sex with a new partner, protect yourself and him/her by wearing a condom.

Whereas, World AIDS Day is December 1 and the focus is on informing youth on the dangers and prevention of this deadly disease.

Therefore, be it resolved, that the ASUM supports the student organized efforts to inform the campus community concerning the dangers of STD, and the practice of safe sex (if one makes the choice).
