June 7th, 1913, 8-30 P. M.

Meeting called to order by President E. B. Craighead.

Schedule informally discussed. Prof. Carey announced that Schedule Committee would be ready to report Tuesday morning.

Motion seconded and carried, "that visitors be enrolled in the Summer School and secure permission from instructors to attend lectures and be required to register as visitors."

Motion seconded and carried, "that light refreshments for the Faculty and Student reception, be provided by the Faculty, per assessment of the members of the Faculty."

Motion seconded and carried, "that the Schedule hours in force last year be the same this year."

Motion seconded and carried, "that attendance shall be kept of all regular students and visitors."

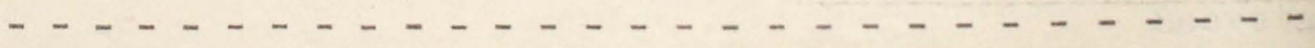
