The meeting was called to order by ASUM President Garth Jacobson at 7:10 p.m. in the Montana Rooms.

Last Weeks Minutes stand as approved (October 11, 1978)

President's Report

1.) Senator Melcher will be here October 31, for a noon forum. He will make a presentation and then have a question and answer period.

2.) Parking Situation: Student parking fees could go up to \$10.00 per quarter. An ad hoc committee will be set up to look into alternatives and solutions to: increased parking fees, try to alleviate parking problem, paving a certain lot, etc. Frank Mann will be chairman, anyone interested can join this committee.

3.) No selection of Central Board candidates because all of the interviews were not completed.

Business Manager's Report

Passed Sijihua's Fund Balance as ammended: Asked for \$478.42. \$98 for telephone, \$100 for out-of-state/travel, \$280 for equipment, a typewriter. Budget and Finance felt they hadn't researched the cost of the typewriter, so the group was asked to do a little more research and then come back.

SAC - Special Allocation: \$362 or \$290, whatever air fare would be. FAILED. Budget and Finance felt all sources of getting money were not exhausted. If they couldn't get money from some other source, they could come back.

HOLMQUIST - Special Allocation: \$354 to send him to College Night in Pheonix, Arizona for recruiting purposes. FAILED with 4-2 margin. Budget and Finance felt President Bowers could pay for the student's fare.

Old Business

1.) Grizzly Pool Committee Report - Cary Holmquist:

They are in the process of getting information from the health officials regarding the cleanliness of the pool. Jim Ball was out of town this week so couldn't ask him about alternatives. An interview with Del Brown, Director of Student Services, will be held regarding possible alternative funding for the pool. The goal is to have no direct charge, either the \$10 charge or the 50¢ charge, by winter quarter.

2.) Survey on Core Requirements - Monica Conrad:

Called 150 people at random. 38% favored group requirements, 62% favored status quo. 81% wanted to choose any class. Copies of the poll are available at ASUM. Most important aspect to remember: Kaimin came out with an article saying that through an informal poll, students favored group requirements. This poll showed that students did not want group requirements.

ACHENBACH stated that there was 92% confidence that this poll is valid. The Faculty was given the results. Faculty Senate will vote on it within the next couple of weeks. If Faculty Senate is against the poll, an alternative proposal will be submitted. However, ASCRC will take a formal stand for the students.

New Business

1.) Fast for World Harvest - Gayle Sandholm, guest speaker

November 16 will be the fifth annual Fast for World Harvest. This is a nationwide fast on university campuses. Events scheduled will be: Fast at the food service, enabling students to miss 1, 2, or 3 meals. 50% of the cost of the food will go to the Poverello Center, 50% will go to Oxfam America. A forum will be held in the UC. A noon meeting on Wednesday, Nov. 15, on nutrition will be held in the UC. A nationwide t.v. series, The Fight for Food, will be held Sunday, Nov. 12; Monday, Nov. 13; Tuesday, Nov. 14; and Thursday, Nov. 16. Possibly there will be speakers to talk about human technology, life styles, nutrition, and world hunger situation. Also there is a possibility of applying for grants.

JACOBSON entertained a motion to set up a committee to help with this event.

Discussion followed.

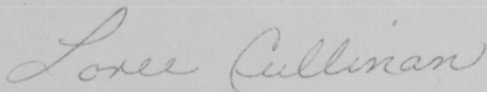
