MISSOULA---Montana State University will host upwards of 50 Skyline conference golfers Friday and Saturday in 36-hole medal play that will determine the league's top team and individual linksmen. The conference meet is scheduled at the Missoula Country Club. Eighteen holes will be played Friday, with the concluding round of 18 holes scheduled Saturday.

"New Mexico, last year's team winner, is the definite favorite, while Denver, Utah State and Utah are darkhorses," is the comment of MSU golf mentor Ed Chinske. The Grizzly coach feels that his squad, which has run dead last in Skyline golf competition for two seasons, stands a chance to vacate the league cellar.

"We have the advantage of familiarity with the course, and we've played improved golf in the past couple weeks," Chinske commented. His top four men-- Jim Bryngelson, Ted and Bill Hodges, and Ray Maidment--warmed up with identical $12\frac{1}{2}$ - $5\frac{1}{2}$ twin victories over Montana State College 10 days ago. Other Grizzlies who will compete for individual honors are Roger Norgaard and Fred Jewell.

Each Skyline school will enter four men in team competition, while an unlimited number of entries will be accepted for individual medal play.

The Grizzlies will warm up for the conference meet with a Wednesday dual meet encounter with Utah State.

Scores of last year's team play include New Mexico, 602; Colorado State, 609; BYU, 629; Denver, 640; Utah State 641; Utah, 652; Wyoming, 663; and Montana, 717.
