Additions to the botany and zoology faculties at Montana State University have been announced by MSU President H. K. Newburn. Appointed assistant professors of botany are Dr. James R. Habeck and Clarence C. Gordon. Dr. Lynn B. Graves has been named assistant professor of zoology.

Dr. Habeck comes to MSU from the biology faculty of Oregon State College of Education, Monmouth. At MSU he will be in charge of <sup>the</sup> advanced course in ecology and will direct graduate students in ecology. His B. S., M. S. and Ph. D. degrees were earned at the University of Wisconsin. He has published articles in technical journals.

Gordon, who was a laboratory instructor at MSU spring quarter, will direct graduate students in mycology and forest pathology. He has a B. A. from the University of Washington and will receive the Ph. D. from Washington State University at the end of the summer session. He is the author of published papers on phytopathology.

Dr. Graves will teach advanced courses in comparative physiology. After serving with the U. S. Marine Corps from 1946 to 50, he earned a B. A. at Ohio Wesleyan University and a Ph. D. at Ohio State University. He held a Muellhaupt postdoctoral scholarship in biology last year.
