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The meeting was called to order by President Nockleby at 6:05 p.m.

O'GRADY MOVED TO PUT FINALIZATION OF BUDGETING ON WEDNESDAY. WARREN SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED: 3-6. Central Board will meet at 6 and final budgeting will begin at 3 p.m.

President Nockleby read a letter he received in reference to the rugby team. He also said that he would have several letters concerning groups who have requested money from ASUM in the ASUM office for CB members to read.

Art Student League--O'GRADY MOVED TO ACCEPT THE EXECUTIVE RECOMMENDATION OF \$475. BANKS SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED.

University Choir--BOWEN MOVED TO ACCEPT THE EXECUTIVE RECOMMENDATION OF \$1,390. MURRAY SECONDED. There was unanimous consent of the CB to let the University Choir use the money for instate travel if the trip to Poland does not materialize. MOTION CARRIED.

Radical Student Coalition--WARREN MOVED ZERO DOLLARS FOR THE RECOMMENDATION. IACOPINI SECONDED.

MURRAY MOVED TO ACCEPT THE EXECUTIVE RECOMMENDATION OF \$600 AS A SUBSTITUTE MOTION. BANKS SECONDED.

The discussion and voting was postponed until a representative was present.

Concert Band--WARD MOVED TO ACCEPT THE EXECUTIVE RECOMMENDATION OF \$2,904. O'GRADY SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED.

O'Grady commented that CB is overbudget... about \$37,307.

CB Vacancy--Central Board voted to see whether they would accept the committee sheet list for this vacancy as a valid application, or extend the deadline another week. The vote was 11-8 to accept the committee sheet list as applicants. The following volunteered to call these people: Brown, Short, Banks, Bowen, Strobel.

President Nockleby said that he had had a meeting with President Bowers to discuss the women's intercollegiate proposal. Bowers stated that if CB stipulated that the women's intercollegiate athletics could not give fee waivers or scholarships, then the administration would not accept the student funds of \$16,402.

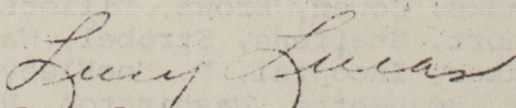
Nockleby felt that CB should have some control over this account and not allow what happened with the men's program who were allocated money and then left alone. The men's program was "rubber-stamped" from the beginning, and line items were not even considered. CB could have had control over that account if they had desired to do so. It must be remembered that just because we have control over the funding doesn't mean we control the program. Nockleby reported that Bowers wants the program to continue at the level it is at the present time. Nockleby had asked Bowers if he would pressure other colleges to put scholarships on a need basis. Nockleby said that the short term and long term plans of President Bowers must be considered. Warren stated that what people like Bowers say in private may not be the same thing that he says in public. Nockleby felt that Bowers would say the same thing. Short felt that CB should stick to their word, because CB should have realized when the resolution was made that this action of the administration could probably happen. Elliott proposed that CB be as tough as they can, and didn't think CB should show a mellow position, but be radical and uncompromising. President Nockleby said that CB should have a non-conciliatory attitude. Bowen felt that it would not be productive to invite President Bowers to speak to CB. Nockleby said that there are various programs that might be better funded by the administration, mainly the fine arts, campus recreation, etc, and eliminate CB support on salaries, day care, and other programs that students receive credit. Nockleby asked for a couple of members to look into the principles of who should be funded by ASUM, and what programs should be shifted to the administration. Warren suggested that Budget and Finance come up with a policy on this. Nockleby asked for an ad hoc committee: Brown and Short volunteered to look into the program.

Budget cut committee--Nockleby asked for volunteers to form a committee and propose cuts in the budget. Volunteers were: Ward, Iacopini, Baker, Strobel, and Johnson. This committee will meet Tuesday, May 20 at 3:30.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Communications--Nockleby read letters pertaining to Women's place and their budget request, Women's Intercollegiate Athletics budget request, and letter from North Plains Resource Council 1 (this letter will be on the bulletin board for CB members to read).

President's Committee on Public Relations--President Bowers will appoint this committee to look into ideas for public relations for the university. One idea that was mentioned was to have workshops from the departments for the high schools in the area to show what the students can get out of going to school here at the university. O'Grady suggested the committee look into and decide who should fund different areas, such as fine arts, because they promote a lot of public relations. Murray said that it should be remembered that professors putting on workshops still have to be paid, and then they are not teaching university students.

Summer times/summer Kaimin--Nockleby met with President Bowers and after some discussion and debate it was decided that Bowers will allow students to allocate money to let the Summer Kaimin print this summer. The administration is still in control of the money this summer. Nockleby said there will be a final report on the Summer Kaimin at the next meeting.

BUSINESS MANAGER'S REPORT

Program Council--A line item change of \$100 from 900-6, Pop Concerts to 902-7, Lectures.

Nils Ribi, the Business Manager reported that the money allocated for budgeting is overbudgeted \$42,999 in preliminary budgeting. The final total of money allocated must total \$354,987.

COMMITTEES

Budget and Finance--This committee had been asked to make up a policy on inventory. The committee is currently working on this. One member of the committee is discussing this with campus recreation to decide on the control of inventory. The recommendation on this will be made next week. Hahn asked if they could have a policy for all capital equipment, and she also asked for a report on the policy the women's resource center had at the present time on their book inventory.

Proposed Registration Deadline--Warren reported that the faculty senate was split on this proposal. Some want no restrictions and others wanted a lot. Tom Huff will be at the next meeting to answer questions on this.

Big Sky Conference--A schedule for the Big Sky Conference was passed out to the CB members. This schedule was given to Carrie Hahn over the phone by Jack Swarthout. CB members are asked to go to as many meetings as they can, and let Hahn know which meetings they will attend. Nockleby said that President Bowers has agreed to push for athletic scholarships on a need basis.

Women's Intercollegiate Athletics--Nockleby read a letter from Sharon Dinkel, the Director, and she said that no student money has been used for fee waivers. O'Grady said that CB position should not be to bring women's athletics up to men's athletics, but rather bring men's down to women's.

American Youth Hostel Association--RIBI MOVED TO ACCEPT THE PROPOSAL TO JOIN THE AMERICAN YOUTH HOSTEL ASSOCIATION AND SELL THESE MEMBERSHIPS. STEFFENS SECONDED.

O'GRADY MOVED TO SEND THIS PROPOSAL TO BUDGET AND FINANCE FOR THEIR RECOMMENDATION. MURRAY SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED.

Elections Committee--The elections committee appointment will be held off till next fall.

OLD BUSINESS

Library resolution on gay books--WARREN MOVED TO ACCEPT R75-12. JORDAN SECONDED. WARREN MOVED A FRIENDLY AMENDMENT TO CHANGE THE WORLD "LIBERATION" TO "CULTURE". Murray suggested we vote against this because CB priorities must be considered. O'Grady felt that the academic areas need books more, along with magazines and various journals. Warren said that CB must remember that when the Lambda budget was considered, the Board suggested that the library be asked to get more books on this subject. A member of the audience said that there were no books at all in the library in this area, and covers such a broad area because it has been ignored so long. Bowen said that some compromise should occur because

CB did agree to approve this action. P. Nockleby said the little money that is used for books will have to be further divided up if we ask for these books; the departments will have to take further cuts if we do get these books.

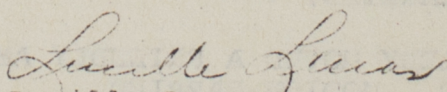
