Mr. Phillips, Chairman of the Summer ations for credit unless students had been regular- Scholarship enrolled in classes. Mr. Phillips also requested weekly reports concerning scholarship and attendance. He called attention to the research grades in teachers' certificate courses in percentage as well as the official grade marks.
