
On motion of Phillips, seconded by Carey, the recommendation was unanimously adopted.

August 29, 1919.

A special meeting of the Faculty was held at 4:10 P. M. on the call of Vice-president Scheuch who presided.

The following members were present: Carey, Daughters, Dawn, Lennes, Leyda, Phillips, Scheuch, Schreiber, F. O. Smith, Thompson.

The minutes of the meeting of August 28th were read and approved.

The Chairman stated that the special order of business was the consideration of the candidacy of Mr. W. R. Wyatt for the degree of Bachelor of Arts at the end of the summer quarter.

The Registrar read a statement concerning Mr. Wyatt's record, among other things stating that the Committee on Admission and Registration had accepted his credits as fulfilling all the requirements for the degree, and the only question concerning his fulfillment of all requirements was his residence.

The following motion was made by F. O. Smith and seconded by Schreiber:

Inasmuch as the Committee on Admission and Registration accepted Mr. Wyatt's credits as satisfying all requirements except that of residence, and it further appearing that Mr. Wyatt is a graduate of the State Normal College and further that he will have earned in this institution at the end of the present summer quarter a total number of credits


