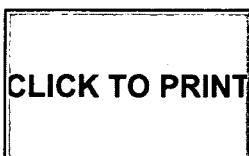

## Dennison call Talking Points:

- Saddam needs to go.
- Time is running out, but there is a little more time.
- We need to use time to layout benchmarks that Saddam must meet to avert war.
- This will help us bring about UN support which is preferred – Although it is always our right to go it alone.
- I pledge my support for the troops, the brave men and women who are fighting to eliminate terrorism
