DEADLINE APPROACHING FOR HUMANITIES RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS MISSOULA —

The Montana Committee for the Humanities at The University of Montana has fellowship money available for humanities research relating to Montana and the region. The deadline for receipt of fellowship proposals is Aug. 21.

While preference may be given to Montana residents, any legal resident of the United States who demonstrates interest and accomplishment in a humanities field is eligible. Scholars and writers not seeking degrees are encouraged to apply. Typically up to three fellowship awards of not more than \$4,000 will be awarded by Nov. 1.

MCH is an independent nonprofit affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities. The humanities include history, philosophy, languages, linguistics, literature, archaeology, jurisprudence, ethics, comparative religions, art history and criticism, and those aspects of the social sciences and the environment that involve humanistic perspectives.
