May 16, 1922.

1. The postponed regular monthly meeting of the Faculty was held at 4:10 P.M., with President Clapp presiding.

2. The following members came in after the meeting was called to order: Owen, Sedman, Smith.

The following members were accounted for: LeClaire, Schwalm, Spaulding, Stone.

3. The minutes of the meeting of April 18th were approved.

4. The President announced that arrangements had been made for an advance registration for the autumn quarter of the present resident students, to begin about May 27th.

5. The President stated that he had referred the rules concerning Senior examinations for honors (adopted at the meeting of the Faculty of May 17, 1921, paragraph 14) during the present quarter to Dean Leaphart for interpretation. The opinion of Dean Leaphart was read, to the effect that the Senior examinations prior to April 1st, 1923, were optional. The President stated that he concurred with Dean Leaphart's opinion; the Senior examinations are to be compulsory for students who voluntarily become candidates for honors for the present quarter. *Examinations for Honors*

A discussion concerning the Senior examination rules ensued. Moved by Merriam, seconded by Daughters, that the Senior examinations cover the major subject only instead of 70 hours as specified in the original rule. Motion was unanimously adopted. Moved by Daughters, seconded by Elrod, to instruct the Scholarship Committee to further investigate the whole subject of Senior examinations and devise a suitable plan for administration and submit a report thereon to the Faculty. Motion adopted. Moved by Merriam, seconded by Phillips, that Senior examination honors be given only on recommendation of the major professor and after examination, and approval by the Faculty. The motion was unanimously adopted.

6. Mr. Carey read a communication from Professor Frances Corbin expressing appreciation of the sympathy of the Faculty in her recent bereavement.

7. Mr. Carey presented a request for approval of \$20.00 from the Faculty fund for a Faculty picnic to be held June 3rd. A motion by Elrod to approve the request for \$20.00 or more was unanimously adopted.

8. The President presented a recommendation from Mr. Burgee asking for a change of grade of Miss C. M. Smith in Economic History of England, #12, winter quarter, to "A", instead of "B". The request was accepted by the Faculty without discussion.

9. Mr. Phillips presented a recommendation from the Committee on Admission and Registration that the following list of candidates be granted the degrees and certificates indicated at the end of the spring quarter provided they complete all requirements in accordance with the rules of the Faculty. Motion was unanimously adopted. *Candidates for degrees*

Mr. Phillips presented a further recommendation from the Committee on Admission and Registration that the name of Mr. Marcus Derr for completion of certificate of course in Law, total credits 130½, be added to the above list. The recommendation was unanimously adopted.

Petition Individual
10. Mr. Phillips presented a petition from Mr. Earl Malone that he be allowed to substitute one quarter's work in Literature 78b, for the second quarter's requirement in Foreign Language, for the degree of Pharmaceutical Chemist. Moved by Elrod that the petition be referred to the Committee on Admission and Registration with power to act. The motion was unanimously adopted.

Resignation of Chancellor Elliot
11. The President at this point announced the resignation of Dr. Edward C. Elliott as Chancellor of the University of Montana and his acceptance of the presidency of Purdue University.

Budget Policy Committee
12. Mr. Underwood, Chairman of the Faculty Committee, on Policy and Distribution of the Budget, gave an informal report and recommendations from the committee. The President complimented the committee upon its work and Mr. Cox moved a standing vote of thanks to the committee, especially to the Chairman. On motion of Elrod the Faculty proceeded to ballot for the members of the committee for the ensuing year. The result of the ballot of the entire Faculty for the member of the committee at large was the election of Professor L. J. Elrod.

Schools, (Journalism, Law, Forestry, Pharmacy, Music, Business Administration) - S. J. Coon and C. W. Leaphart.)

13. There being no further business before the Faculty, the meeting adjourned.
