GREAT FALLS COUPLE HONORED FOR SERVICE TO UM, THEIR COMMUNITY MISSOULA -

The Montana Grizzlies weren't the only ones cheered on by the crowd during Saturday's 53-3 victory over football rival Cal Poly. The crowd of more than 19,000 people also gave a round of applause to John and Sally Seeberger of **Great Falls**.

The Seebergers were presented with a University of Montana Community Service Award for their dedicated service to campus and their hometown communities. The awards are sponsored by UM and coordinated through the UM Alumni Association and the Grizzly Athletic Association.

The Seebergers are enthusiastic members of the Grizzly Athletic Association. John, a 1970 graduate in business, serves on the Great Falls chapter board, which he led as president during 1992-93. Sally, who attended UM during 1968-69, also is a member of the Kappa Alpha Theta Alumni Club.

As vice president of commercial loans for First Interstate Bank in Great Falls, John volunteers on a number of local business and tourism committees. He also chairs the Great Falls School District No. 1 Board of Trustees and is a director for the Montana School Boards Association. John coaches Little League baseball, soccer and flag football in his spare time.

Sally, a former women's clothing store manager, is past president of CIV-AIRES, a civilian-military wives organization that promotes civilian and military interaction. She is a previous member of the Great Falls Advertising Federation. For three years she helped a Vietnamese family start a business, learn the language and attain citizenship.
