**DISNEY WORLD RECRUITS UM STUDENTS FOR INTERNSHIPS**

**MISSOULA --**

University of Montana students will have the opportunity to visit with recruiters from the Walt Disney World College Program on Monday, Oct. 16.

Recruiters will make a presentation about the program at 6 p.m. in Room 122 of the Gallagher Building. On Tuesday, Oct. 17, they will interview interested students in the Office of Career Services, Room 148 of the Lodge. Students must attend the Monday evening presentation in order to interview. UM undergraduate students in any major who have completed at least one semester are eligible for the program.

The Disney program gives students an insider's look at the operation of a Fortune 100 company while they participate in educational courses, work in theme parks and resorts and make friends with college students from around the nation and world. Students also have the opportunity to network with leaders throughout the Walt Disney World Co.

The program offers the following seven courses; students may choose one: Communications, ExpEARiential Learning for the 21st century, Hospitality Management, Human Resource Management, Organizational Leadership, College Program Practicum and Leadership Speaker's Series. The American Council on Education has recommended the courses for credit. Students should meet with their academic advisers for details about earning credit.
