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Minutes from the May 20, 1924 meeting of the University of Montana faculty

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May 20, 1924.

1. The postponed monthly meeting of the faculty was held at 4:10 P. M., on the call of President Clapp, who presided.

3. The minutes of the meeting of March 25th were approved.
4. The President stated that all requests for members of the faculty to deliver Commencement Addresses should be referred to the President's Secretary for scheduling.
5. President Clapp requested that the reports of all departments and divisions of the University for the year ending June 30th ~~should~~ be sent to his office before June 25th.
6. The Committee on Admission and Registration presented a list of candidates for degrees and certificates at the end of the spring quarter. On motion of Mr. Phillips the faculty approved them with the provision that they complete all requirements in accordance with faculty rules.
7. The Committee on Admission and Registration, Mr. Phillips, Chairman, reported that the following candidates for degrees and certificates had complied with all requirements at the end of the winter quarter, March 21, 1924. On motion of W. P. Clark, the faculty decided by a vote of 20 to 14 not to grant honors to Miss Shelton, since she had not made an index of "24". The recommendation of the Committee on Admission and Registration, as amended, was carried.

2. A recommendation from the Curriculum Committee was approved ^{Committee on} as ^{Attainment} follows:

a. "That a standing committee of three members be appointed by the president, which committee shall be called the Committee on Attainment."

b. That this committee be authorized to proceed on the principles embodied in the report [of a sub-committee, of the Curriculum Committee, namely, to find the superior student, to recognize him, and to assist in] and to employ such means and methods in its operations as shall not contravene the rules and regulations of the University."

The President appointed the following ^{as} members of the Committee on Attainment: W. G. Bateman, J. E. Miller, F. O. Smith.

3. The following new courses and changes in curricula, recommended by the Curriculum Committee, were approved by the faculty: ^{New Course}

Chemistry S 1 - Chemistry in the Service of Man. Summer. 2½ credits. No prerequisite.

Chemistry S 2 - Elementary Chemistry. Summer. 2½ credits. No prerequisite, though designed for high school teachers of chemistry.

Education S 21 - Organization and Administration of Vocational Education. Summer quarter. 2½ credits. Prerequisite, junior standing or wide educational experience.

Education S 23 - History of Vocational Education. Summer quarter. 2½ credits. Prerequisite, junior standing or wide educational experience.

Education S 24 - Standards of Instruction in Vocational Education. Summer quarter. 2½ credits. Prerequisite, junior standing or wide educational experience.

Education S 35 - Public School Publicity - changed from 1 2/3 to 4 credits.

Education S 40 - Elementary School Curriculum - changed from 1 2/3 to 4 credits.

Education S 45 - Changed from "Experimental Education and Scientific Method" to "Experimental Education" and from 4-5 to 4 credits.

Forestry 22 - Silvics. Spring quarter. 4 credits. Prerequisite, Botany 22. Replacing Botany 64, Forest Ecology.

Geology S 4 - Field Course in Geology. Summer quarter. 1-2 credits. Field trip in Yellowstone Park at conclusion of first six weeks of summer session.

Geology S 5 - Research. Summer quarter. Credits to be arranged. Open to advanced students in Geology.

History 110 - History of the British Commonwealth. Summer quarter. 4 credits. Prerequisite, junior standing.

History 111 - Medieval Civilization. Summer quarter. 4 credits. Prerequisite, junior standing.

- Home Economics 145 - Methods of Teaching Home Economics. Summer quarter. 3 credits. Replacing Home Economics 137 and 143. Prerequisite, Home Economics and 13.
- Journalism 25 - Editorial Writing - reduced from 3 to 2 quarters.
- Journalism 27abc - History and Principles of Journalism. Dropped from the curriculum.
- Journalism 39abc - Laboratory in Journalism. Reduced from 9 to 6 credits.
- Journalism 48abc - Senior Practice Laboratory. 3 quarters—autumn, winter, spring. 2-5 credits each quarter. Prerequisite, senior standing in Journalism and special proficiency.
- Library Economy S 13 - Library Economy and Organization. Summer quarter. 3 credits.
- Mathematics 12 - Survey of College Mathematics. Length of course - 1 quarter. Given autumn, winter or spring quarters. Prerequisite, one entrance unit of algebra, one entrance unit of geometry.
- Pharmacy 15 - Pharmacognosy. Length of course - one quarter. Spring and summer. 3 credits. Prerequisite, a course in high school or college botany, and Pharmacy 13a.
- Physics 114 - Electricity. Winter quarter. 3 credits. Prerequisite, general physics and integral calculus.
- Physics 115 - Electrical Measurements. Winter quarter. 3 credits. Prerequisite, general physics and integral calculus.
- Physics 122 - Light. Spring quarter. 3 credits. Prerequisite, general physics and integral calculus.
- Physics 123 - Optical Measurements. Spring quarter. 3 credits. Prerequisite, general physics and integral calculus.
- Physics 141 - Sound. 3 cr. Prerequisite, general physics and integral calculus.
- Physics 152 - Modern Physics. Winter quarter. 3 credits. Prerequisite, Physics 114 and 122.
- Physics 154 - Modern Physics. Spring quarter. 3 credits. Prerequisite, Physics 152.
- Physics 180 - Physics Seminar. Spring quarter. 1 credit. Prerequisite, Physics 114 and 122.

School of Religion

14. Upon the recommendation of the Curriculum Committee the faculty approved the following courses to be given next year in the School of Religion by Reverend W. L. Young: History of Religions (autumn quarter); Outline of Hebrew History, as presented in the Old Testament (winter quarter); Beginnings of Christianity (spring quarter). All the courses will meet three hours a week for twelve weeks, and carry three credits, and will be open to sophomores, juniors and seniors.

New Organization

15. The Deans' Conference reported that, in accordance with final action of December 4th empowering the Deans' Conference to take final action in this matter, permission had been given Grover Johnson et al., to form a social fraternity known as the Templars, with the purpose of petitioning Associa.

16. A letter was read from Mrs. Louise Arnoldson, expressing her appreciation of the sympathy of the faculty in her recent bereavement.
17. Upon recommendation of the Faculty Affairs Committee, Mr. Carey, chairman, the faculty approved the allowance of twenty dollars from the Faculty Fund for the faculty picnic to be held the 31st of May. Mr. Carey urged the faculty members either to pay their assessment or give him a statement that they did not desire to join the association.
18. The Schedule Committee, Mr. Merrill, Chairman, reported that Military Science classes meeting between three and six^{on} Friday, May 23rd, would be held the day before, and requested that students with classes meeting at these hours^{on} Thursday be given an opportunity to make up the work missed.
19. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
