HI-LINE FARMER'S ART GOES ON DISPLAY AT MUSEUM

MISSOULA-

An art installation at The University of Montana will bring eastern Montana to life in the Museum of Fine Arts' Henry Meloy Gallery.

"Shelterbelt" by Hi-Line wheat farmer and artist Gary Horinek opens Friday, Jan. 19, in the Performing Arts and Radio/Television Center. The show continues through Feb. 28.

An artist's reception is planned for 5 to 7 p.m. Friday, Feb. 2.

The installation highlights distinctive natural features of Horinek's eastern Montana homeland, such as native grasses and running water, juxtaposed with indoor elements like chairs and windows.
