

8. The President called the attention of the Faculty to the requirement that final examinations may not be given at other times than provided for in the examination schedule except on permission of Chairman Schedule Committee.
9. The Chairman of Advisers, Professor Jesse, called attention to a report on the grades given by the instructional staff in relation to the "grade curve".
10. The President stated that inasmuch as this was the last meeting of the faculty during the regular academic year it was assumed that the faculty would not object to such minor administrative regulations as seemed necessary for the beginning of the next college year.
11. The Chairman of the special Committee on preparation of comprehension tests, for the lower third of entrants from high schools (to be uniform with all units of the University of Montana), Professor F. O. Smith, stated that the Committee recommended that the Otis test be given, or if this test not available, that a combination of existing tests be prepared (matter to be referred to Chancellor's office for further action). *Lower Third*
