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The Associated Students of the University of Montana 1 Resolution Supporting the Creation of Transitional Housing Units for Survivors of 2 Domestic or Sexual Violence at the University of Montana 3 April 12, 2020 4 SB75-19/20 5 6 Authored by: Cierra Anderson, ASUM Senator; 7 Whereas, The Associated Students of the University of Montana (ASUM) is the official student 8 9 government for the University of Montana; 10 Whereas, ASUM established the J. Doe Ad Hoc Committee during Spring 2019 and again for the 11 2019-2020 Senate term in order to create student drive reform around the issues of sexual assault 12 and domestic violence; 13 14 Whereas, Nearly 20 people per minute are abused by an intimate partner in the United States1; 15 16 Whereas, 1 in 5 women and 1 in 71 men in the United States has been raped in their lifetimes2; 17 18 Whereas, Women aged 18 to 25 are the most commonly abused by an intimate partner and 19 college-aged persons are at the highest risk for experiencing sexual assault³; 20 21 Whereas, Transgender, gender-queer, and gender non-conforming college students also face 22 higher rates of sexual assault3; 23 24 Whereas, Domestic violence is attributed with being the leading cause of homelessness for 25 women and children, with 22% - 57% of all homeless women reporting that domestic violence 26 27 was the immediate cause of their homelessness4; 28 Whereas, Safety and affordable housing are the top two concerns for over 80% of survivors 29 30 entering a shelter4; 31 Whereas, Transitional housing is "temporary housing used to facilitate the movement of 32 individuals and families experiencing homelessness to permanent housing within 24 months or 33 such longer periods...as deemed necessary"5; 34 35 Whereas, Increased availability of resources, including housing services, could lead to a higher 36 number of survivors reporting their abuse or assault while attending university; 37 38 Whereas, Increased availability of resources could lead to a higher number of survivors seeking 39 additional resources such as legal representation or counseling services; 40 41 Whereas. Missoula only has one shelter in place for domestic violence and the two closest 42 shelters outside of Missoula are located in Ravalli and Flathead counties; 43 44 Whereas, The YWCA's SAFE Shelter has seven bedrooms available specifically designed for 45 survivors of domestic violence; 46

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48 49	Whereas, Ada's Place is a transitional housing service offered by the YWCA that is "designed help homeless survivors of domestic violence and their children" and has 6 two-bedroom	to
50	duplexes, 5 one-bedroom apartments and 3 two-bedroom apartments;	
51 52 53	Whereas, None of the housing units offered by the YWCA allow pets and there is a \$400 security deposit, plus a monthly rent equivalent to 30% of the survivor's adjusted gross	
54	income ⁷ ;	
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56 57	Whereas, In 2018 there were over 200 cases of domestic violence in Missoula County that resulted in cases being filed in court ⁸ ;	
58	Whereas, If all of those survivors needed emergency housing, Missoula would be unable to	
59 60 61	provide a much-needed resource;	
62 63	Whereas, The University of Montana has operated on an informal housing program for survivors;	
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65	Whereas, There are numerous issues associated with an informal system, such as safety,	
66	availability of resources, training, and the economic impact on a survivor;	
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68	Whereas, A formalized system would alleviate these issues by allowing more collaboration	. 1.
69 70	between the different resources and entities on campus, by creating a survivor centered approach which would include extensive trainings on domestic and sexual violence for everyone involved	er ed
