September 22, 1931

1. The first meeting of the faculty for the year 1931-32 was held at 3:00 P. M. on the call of President Clapp, who presided.

2. The following members were present: Abbott, Ames, Ammer, Angus, Asendorf, Atkinson, Badgley, Bateman, Bealer, Bennett, Mrs. Bischoff, Carey, Fay Clark, W. P. The following member was accounted for: Harry Adams.

3. The minutes of the meetings of June 5 and August 13 were approved.

4. New members of the faculty and those returned from leaves of absence were introduced by President Clapp.

5. Mr. Carey, Chairman of the Faculty Affairs Committee, gave a financial report of the committee, which showed a cash balance of \$4.93, and asked for payments of the annual dues of \$1.00 per member.

6. The Enlarged Committee on Admission and Graduation, Dean Jesse, Chairman, reported the following exceptions to faculty rules granted during the spring quarter and summer session:

1. John Keyes was granted permission to receive the degree of Bachelor of Arts with majors in Mathematics and Journalism. This action was taken since Mr. Keyes offered 203 credits for his degree and completed the major requirements in the department of Mathematics and the School of Journalism.

2. Miss Dorothy Lewis was granted permission to do by correspondence study eleven of the last forty-five credits toward her degree.

3. Mrs. Elva Bingham was granted permission to graduate with the degree of Bachelor of Arts, major History, also a major in Education. This action was taken since Mrs. Bingham offered a total of 203 credits for her degree and fulfilled the requirements for a major in both Education and History.

4. Mr. George Haney was granted permission to satisfy the major requirements in Spanish by offering 39½ credits rather than 40 credits, which is the minimum requirement for a major. This action was taken for the reason that Mr. Haney had two years of Spanish in high school and was permitted to omit Spanish 15b although he completed the course in Spanish 15a.

5. Mr. William Curley was granted permission to satisfy the major requirements in Latin by offering 39 credits. Mr. Curley had three years of Latin in High school and placed in Latin 15a while the normal placement would have been 13b or 13c.

6. Mr. B. F. Thrailkill was granted permission to satisfy the major requirements in Mathematics by offering 35 credits. This action was taken since Mr. Thrailkill had four years of mathematics in high school, which included one-half unit of trigonometry, one-half unit of Solid Geometry, and one-half unit of College Algebra. These courses are offered for college credit at the State University.

7. Miss Dorothy Schultz was granted permission to receive final credit in Chemistry 13ab without completing Chemistry 13c and to satisfy the restricted elective requirement for the degree of Bachelor of Arts by offering ten credits in Chemistry, Chemistry 13ab, and three credits in Geology 16. The reasons for granting this petition were that Miss Schultz has been under nervous tension as the result of an accident which occurred last fall and that she completed satisfactorily the first two quarters of the work during the year 1927-28, receiving grades of "B" and "C".

8. Walter Burrell was granted permission to complete 15 of the last 45 credits for his degree by correspondence. The courses completed by correspondence were required for the restricted elective requirement in foreign language. The remainder of Mr. Burrell's credits toward the degree were earned in residence.

7. The Committee on Admission and Graduation, Ames, Chairman, reported that all the candidates for degrees and certificates who were provisionally approved by the faculty on August 13 completed all requirements, with the exception of the following:


