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April 8, 1932

1. A meeting of the faculty was held at 4:10 P. M. on the call of President Clapp, who presided.

2. 4. The Committee on Admission and Graduation, Ames, Chairman, reported that all the candidates for degrees and certificates whose names appeared on the list sent to the faculty on March 9 completed requirements for their respective degrees and certificates with the exception of the following:

5. The Curriculum Committee, by President Clapp, Chairman, recommended that the faculty approve the following new courses:

Economics and Sociology

190 Independent work; offered any quarter; credits variable; prerequisite, demonstrated special ability.

Education

S21 Montana Course of Study; 4 credits; prerequisite, sophomore standing or teaching experience.

S23 Problems of the Junior High School Grades; 2½ credits; prerequisite, sophomore standing or teaching experience.

S108 School Accounting; 4 credits; prerequisite, advanced standing in Education.

S109 The Child Centered School; 4 credits; prerequisite, advanced standing and Education 18 and 19 or equivalent.

S149 Vocational Education - Teaching of Related Subjects; 4 credits; prerequisite, advanced standing in Vocational Education and consent of the instructor.

170 Seminar in Secondary Education; 3 to 5 credits; prerequisite, advanced standing, Education 22 or equivalent and 20 credits in Education.



History and Political Science

- 116 The American Colonies, 1600-1776; 2½ credits; prerequisite, Junior standing and 8 credits of United States History.

Pharmacy

- 135 Advanced Analysis; 2 to 6 credits; prerequisite, Pharmacy 25 and 31.

Law

Creditor's Rights; 3 quarters; 2 credits per quarter; replacing Bankruptcy, 3 credits.

Municipal Corporations; 3 quarters, 2 credits per quarter; replacing Municipal Corporations, 3 credits.


The recommendation was unanimously approved.

7. Mr. Ames announced the date of the American Council Comprehensive examinations as May 3 and 4 and asked for the co-operation of the faculty.

8. On the recommendation of Mr. Bateman, Chairman, Committee on Graduate Study, the faculty unanimously recommended to the State Board of Education that the honorary degree of Doctor of Science be granted to Mr. Emil Alfred Starz of Helena.
