ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT MEETING COMES TO GLENDIVE

MISSOULA-

State government and university officials will host a series of economic development meetings across eastern Montana in coming weeks in an effort to spur business growth in the region. The meetings are free and open to the public.

One of these Business Rural and Outreach Sessions will be held in **Glendive** on Friday, Jan. 25. The meeting will run from 8:30 to 10:30 a.m. at Dawson Community College -- in either the Board Room or Room 131.

The meeting will describe resources and assistance available to businesses through the Montana University System and state government. Montana entrepreneurs will learn about grants of up to \$750,000 that they may be eligible for. They also will rub shoulders with contacts who assist emerging Montana companies with technology, business expertise and funding.

Attendees also will learn about Virtual Manufacturing Networks for Montana, which are created to help small, rural companies with specialized focuses collaborate with one another. The networks could help remote companies band together to bid on projects usually available only to larger companies.
