
31 Vocational Psychology, 4 credits.

The above recommendations were unanimously approved except section I - 3 which lost by a vote of 20 to 22. The following substitute recommendation was offered by Elrod, seconded by Ames, and adopted:

"That the survey courses are primarily for students in the lower divisions of the college. However, students in the upper divisions may be admitted to these courses in exceptional circumstances".

7. The President stated that retiring allowances for members of the faculty had been discussed by the Budget and Policy Committee. On motion of Carey, the faculty unanimously authorized the President to appoint a committee of five to investigate and report concerning a plan for retiring allowances. (The President subsequently appointed Merrill (Chairman), Leaphart, Line, Severy, and Speer).


