3. The minutes of the meeting of December 14, 1934 were approved.

4. The following announcements were made by Dean Jesse:

(1) That the grades for the winter quarter, 1935 are due in the Registrar's Office on Saturday, March 23rd, at 4:00 P.M.

(2) That instructors should announce in their Friday classes the time at which his particular examination is to be held in order to avoid misunderstanding and a great deal of confusion in attendance.

(3) That no instructor should excuse a student from a final final final examination without first notifying the Registrar's Office. If the examinestructors will follow this recommendation, a great deal of time and confusion will be avoided in the matter of attendance at final examinations:

5. The Enlarged Committee on Admission and Graduation, Jesse Chairman, reported that the following exceptions to faculty rules were granted during the autumn quarter, 1934:

(1) Re: Emmeline McKittrick. Miss McKittrick was granted permission to receive final credit in Bus. Admin. 22b, Shorthand. The Committee waived the "n" status of this course because it is necessary for Miss McKittrick to count the Shorthand credit toward a minor in Business Administration in order to be eligible to receive her certificate to teach by the end of the spring quarter.
