

(2) Communications from members of the faculty to the State Board of Education and the State Purchasing Agent should be transmitted through the President's Office, and the President's Office will transmit such communications to Executive Secretary Swain for presentation to the proper officer or board.

3. The following report of activities of the Enlarged Committee on Admission and Graduation, taken in accordance with previous authorization of the faculty, was made by Dean Jesse:

The Committee on Admission and Graduation Enlarged for Administrative Action, reports the following exceptions to Faculty Rules Granted During the Autumn Quarter, 1935.

1. Re: Grant Kelleher. Mr. Kelleher petitioned to be permitted to satisfy the residence requirement for graduation by earning in residence 20 rather than 35 of the last 45 credits required for the degree of Bachelor of Arts. Mr. Kelleher is at present employed as a lawyer in the Department of Justice in Washington, D.C., but intends to enter the Harvard Law School sometime in the near future.
