1. A meeting of the faculty was held at 4:10 P. M. on the call of President Simmons, who presided.

- 2. The minutes of the meeting of March 30th were approved.
- 3. The following announcements were made by the President:
- (1) The following actions of the State Board of Education were reported:
- a. WHEREAS: This Board on Sept. 9, 1935, ordered the removal from the libraries of the six units of the University of Montana of certain objectionable or controversial books:

RESOLVED: That as a matter of practical operation such order be and is hereby modified to read as follows:

The president and faculty of each unit of the University of Montana are charged with the responsibility of seeing

---that proper standards are maintained at each such institution in the selection, purchase, distribution, and use of books, plays, and periodicals of all sorts;

---that any writings found unsuitable for immature student reading shall not be admitted to the general or open shelves of the library of such institution;

concerned in the type of plays performed and in the character of material used in student and faculty publications,

in order that a proper high level of good taste and public decorum may obtain.

- b. The State Board of Education authorized the awarding of a one-year scholarship in the School of Journalism for the year 1936-37 to the editor of the best CCC camp newspaper in the Ninth Army Corps Area as determined by a competition to be handled through Major General Paul D. Malone, U. S. A., and the best twenty-five papers submitted to the three teaching members of the staff of the School of Journalism.
- of Item 6402 adopted by the Board December 5, 1932, by adding the words underscored below, so as to read as follows:

THAT, The State Board of Education approve the assessment by any unit of the University of Montana on the request of an instructor in charge of any certain course of a special

textbook fee not to exceed one dollar and a half in any one quarter to be paid by every student registered in such course, for the purchase of books or other materials for classroom instruction or study, to be used by the students in such course, books and other materials so purchased to be the property of the institution, and the fees to be collected and expended through the regular business office, provided that no such fee shall be assessed until the request for such fee has been approved by the head of the department concerned, the president of the institution and the Chancellor of the University of Montana.

- (2) That the State Board of Education had approved the recommendation that the honorary degree of LL.D. be granted to Mr. James H. Rowe of Butte, but that Mr. Rowe had not yet accepted; and that the recommendation for the honorary degree of LL.D. to former Chancellor Brannon had been approved, but that as yet no response had been received from him.
- (3) That the following committee on faculty honors was appointed:

Jesse - Dean of Faculty
Rowe - Chairman Budget and Policy Committee
Lennes - Chairman Research Committee

(4) That the following committee to consider and make recommendations concerning a graduate school was appointed:

Bateman, chairman Lennes, secretary Deiss Phillips Waters

(5) That the following changes in departmental organization were authorized:

Department of Latin and Greek, separated from the Department of Foreign Languages; that Department of Foreign Languages should be designated "Modern Languages"; and that Department of Biology should be designated "Department of Zoology and Bacteriology".

- (6) That a search of the minutes showed that actions relative to voting priviledges in faculty meetings had been taken at meetings of September 16, 1916, December 9, 1918, April 8, 1919, October 14, 1919, April 13, 1920. Excerpts from the minutes of these meetings were read.
- 4. The Committee on Admission and Graduation, Ames, chairman, recommended that the faculty accept the following students as candidates for degrees and certificates at the end of the spring quarter, June 8, 1936, with the provision that they complete requirements for their respective degrees and certificates in accordance with faculty rules. The motion was unanimously approved.
