STATEMENT OF SENATOR MIKE MANSFIELD (D-MONT)

Mr. President, the New York Times of July 11, 1970, carries a very interesting and captivating story on the wife of our distinguished senior Senator from Arizona, Fred Harris. The article, entitled "Champion of the Indian," describes the work, the attitude, the integrity and the desire of LaDonna Crawford Harris, the wife of Senator Harris.

I know, personally, of her great and primary interest in the welfare of the Indians ever since she and her husband came to the Senate. I know of the long hours she has put in in their behalf while her husband, in the Senate, has put in long hours and contributed great knowledge to the cause of good Indian legislation. They make a great team and the first Americans of this Nation are fortunate to have as their champion, Senator Fred Harris in the Senate, and LaDonna Crawford Harris, outside the Senate.
