ANACONDA RESIDENTS RECEIVE UM SCHOLARSHIPS

MISSOULA--

Two University of Montana juniors, both 1999 graduates of **Anaconda** High School, have been awarded scholarships for the 2002-2003 academic year from the Department of Political Science.

Shavonne Maes, the daughter of Laurin and Kris Maes of Anaconda, received a \$1,000 Susan K. Grebeldinger Scholarship. The scholarship was established in 1991 by Grebeldinger, a 1981 UM political science graduate. Grebeldinger earned a law degree from Yale in 1984.
