

3. The following announcements were made:
 - (a) By Dean Jesse:
 - (1) Grade reports for spring quarter are due in the Registrar's Office not later than 3 p.m., Wednesday, June 14.
 - (2) Survey reports of course contents are past due.
 - (b) By Director of Summer Session Shallenberger: Prospect for summer session indicates larger attendance than preceding year.
 - (c) By Carey, Chairman of Faculty Affairs Committee: Inasmuch as a smaller reserve will be carried over this year than last year, it is asked that members who have not paid for this year do so promptly.
 - (d) By Deiss, Chairman of Library Committee: The stacks in the library will be closed except on permit cards beginning June 12 (faculty excepted).
 - (e) By Merrill, Chairman of Faculty Retirement Committee, and State Treasurer Shannon (who was present at the meeting). Explanation and discussion of teachers' retirement law as it affects members of the staff of the University institutions.

7. The President announced the election of the faculty members of the Student-Council Faculty Council. On motion of Rowe, the present members (Castle, Coleman, Howard, Mansfield, Merrill) were unanimously re-elected.

8. The President announced the reappointment of Professor Shallenberger as member of the Service Committee and the election of the member to be selected by the faculty. (Dean Leaphart was placed in nomination by Lennes; a motion to close nominations was made, seconded, and adopted without dissenting vote, and Dean Leaphart was declared elected. Objection was then made by Professor F. G. Clark to the viva voce method of election; whereupon the President, after conferring with the Faculty Secretary on previous procedure, announced nomination and election to be made by ballot. A member called attention to parliamentary procedure whereby the faculty has the privilege of conducting its elections as it sees fit. A motion was then made, seconded, and carried (a vote by show of hands being taken) to rescind the viva voce election of Dean Leaphart, and to proceed to an election by ballot.) A ballot was then taken and Dean Leaphart received 61 out of 86 votes cast, whereupon the president announced that Dean Leaphart had been duly elected to the Service Committee.


9. The President announced the election of members to the Budget and Policy Committee, and that the procedure of the preceding years would be followed in the election of the chairman (a majority on nominating ballot would result in an election; otherwise, a vote would be taken on the two highest). A nominating ballot was then taken.) Professor Rowe received 45 out of 87 votes cast, and having received a majority of all votes cast, was therefore declared duly elected as Chairman of the Budget and Policy Committee.
