Dean Robert E. Sullivan of the Montana State University Law School has been reappointed to the Legal Committee of the Interstate Oil Compact Commission by Texas Gov. Price Daniel, compact chairman. In his announcement, Gov. Daniel said the appointment was made with the approval of the Executive Committee of the IOCC.

The dean has served on the Legal Committee since 1952, under appointments by the governors of Indiana, Illinois, Wyoming, New Mexico, Montana and Kansas.

Dean Sullivan is a trustee of the Rocky Mountain Mineral Law Foundation. He was commissioned by the American Bar Association to edit, and write the main part of, the recently published "Conservation of Oil and Gas: A Legal History." He has done editorial work for oil and gas publications, is a contributor to "American Law of Mining," five-volume publication of Matthew Bender & Co., and is the author of "Handbook of Oil and Gas Law."

The IOCC was authorized by Act of Congress to work for conservation of gas and oil. Montana, brought into the compact by state legislative action, is one of 30 member states.
