Montana State University has been awarded a \$17,982 U. S. Public Health Service grant to conduct a three-year study of a type of roundworm found in sheep, cattle and deer, MSU officials announced.

Dr. Clyde M. Senger, assistant professor of zoology, will direct the project, titled "Hatching of free-living larva of Nematodirus spathiger." His research assistants will be Donald J. Forrester, graduate student from Mansfield, Mass., and Robert Ruff, senior from Laurel.

Dr. Senger's research is directed primarily toward increasing basic scientific knowledge, but it may ultimately lead to practical application in the control of parasitic nematodes of domestic and game animals.
