chances for the success of the bill in the legislature. The motion was duly seconder and adopted without dissenting vote.

5. The following resolution was presented by Professor W. P. Clark, who moved its adoption:

Dr. Ernest O. Melby on July 1, 1944 will again become President of Montana State, University. In view of this fact I wish to move:

1. That we, the Faculty of Montana State University, give Dr. Me

a vote of welcome as our President;

2. That we express to him our full confidence in him as a leader in education in the state and nation; that we commend him for his courage, energy and foresight in presenting the problems of education in our state and the nation;

3. That notice of this vote of confidence be given to the state and nation through the Montana State University News Service.

The motion was duly seconded and adopted, with the provision that publicity of the resolution be not earlier than July 1 and at the discretion of the President and Director of the University News Service (Dean Ford).

6. There being no further business before the faculty, the meeting adjourned.

August 12, 1944

1. A meeting of the faculty (Summer Session and ASTRP) was held August 10 at 4:00 p.m. on the call of Summer Session Director, W. A. Anderson, who presided.

3. Dr. Merrill, Coordinator, reported on the ASTR Program, with regard to the currical and plans for readjustment.

Dean Anderson spoke briefly on plans for the 1945 Summer Session. He asked faculty members particularly to keep in mind the University change from a nine to a twelve-months service plan in deciding offerings for the coming summer session. He also called for suggestions for improvements in next year's summer session and asked the faculty members to submit in writing or to call in any recommendations they might wish to make later. He thanked the members of the faculty for their cooperation for making the Summer School so successful.
